EVENTS OF THE YEAR



Disaster Management Orientation Program was organized to spread awareness among girls and women of any disaster or epidemic so that they are able to help themselves and others in any adverse situation with an appropriate understanding . First aid techniques for all kinds of calamities such as Floods, Fire outbreak, Snake Bite, Lightening, Stampede, Road accident , were taught to our beneficiaries and the staff members off Deepalaya. The guests included Smt. Swati Vaisyantry (Chief Warden–Bihar Civil Defence), Dr. Uttima Keshari (Chairperson Deepalaya), Mr Aditya Ranjan (DDMT), Mr Rai Vidrohi (Fire Officer, Purnia), Mr Akhilesh Kumar O/IC–SDRF Bihar Team, Purnia, Dr. A.K.Raman(Secretary ,Deepalaya).

Ration Distribution Program was organized during the COVID-19 pandemic as a part of Covid-19 awareness program.

In this event, all 50 trainees of the NOMI Foundation Phase-1 batch were given some quantity of ration as a gesture of support during the pandemic by our Chairperson Dr. Smt. Uttima Keshari.

Each packet of ration contained : Rice(10kg), Soyabean(500gm), Mustard oil(1ltr), Sugar(2kg), Chana Dal(2kg), Tea leaves(250gm) along with tablets of zinc & PCM(500) tablets, sanitizers and masks.

An effort was put to help our trainees during the Covid-19 pandemic by this program. They were also made aware about the prevailing situations. Emphasis was put on vaccination needs and following the prescribed guidelines of the government.

Distribution of Happiness Kit to our beneficiaries .The program of distribution of happiness kit was a part of Covid-19 awareness events that were being organized at Deepalaya. In the presence of our Chairperson Dr. Smt. Uttima Keshari ,our Secretary Dr. A.K.Ramna and all staff members of Deepalaya , 23 COW(Community Outreach Workers) were presented this happiness kit .

Each kit contained: 50 pcs of masks, a Sanitizer(500ml), Hand wash(500ml),Vit C capsule(10N), ParacetamolTablets(10N),Dettol(1N), Towel(1N),Mask(50N), Zinc Covet Tablets(10N), Sanitary Pads(2N), Biscuits(1N), Chocolate(1N), Ludo board(1N), Haldiram Snacks(400gm).



Women's Day 2021. The campaign theme for International Women's Day, 2021 is "Choose To Challenge". The main motto of this awareness program was to celebrate women's achievements, raise awareness about women's equality. 

Depreciation on fixed assets has been provided at the rate fixed by the management.






Covid-19 Pandemic Campeign



Covid-19's first wave had barely subsided and people were yet to recover from the traumas of it when the news of Covid-19's second wave had started to proliferate in and around the month of April 2021. The first wave had hit us all hard enough to withstand the second wave. The fear of getting infected made it difficult for us to execute awareness programs for the public. The death tolls and infection rates had risen since the first wave. We planned, discussed, drew conclusion from it, and finally went decided to spread awareness and provide relief in areas that were not pretentious. We wanted to initiate this program from the grassroot levels and what better way to implement it than initiating it with our very own stakeholders. We organized training campaigns. We organized training campaigns where the need to follow government mandate guidelines were taught to the participants. To promote the campaign sanitizers and masks were given to each participating trainee. Training the beneficiaries made it more easier for us to spread our message among the local masses. After carrying out the program in non-pretentious areas, we comprehended that it was much required in areas where public gathering was a daily scenario, like Monday markets, fish markets, ration shops and medicine shops etc. With the help of our partners The Reliance Foundation, ACT Grants, SATTVA, United Way Bengaluru, we distributed nearly 28000 masks amongst the public. We organized two health camps this year to constantly remind the locals to keep a check on blood pressure, blood sugar and heart health.



22 of our outreach workers were involved in spreading awareness among the local masses. Daily outreach programs involving door to door visit of the households, demonstrations on the benefits of vaccines and distribution of masks were done. A total of 1000 households were covered in this campaign, adding to the 6000 household covered in the year 2020. Safety of our volunteers were our prior objective while carrying out this event. Each worker was well protected with face masks, face shields, ample amount of sanitizers and gloves. Safety was our first priority.


